Petition to the House of Commons

Whereas:

- Choosing "medical assistance in dying" (MAiD) due to lack of available services or treatments is not a real choice;
- Allowing MAiD for those with disabilities or chronic illness who are not dying devalues their lives, tacitly endorsing the notion that life with disability is optional, and by extension, dispensable;
- Offering MAiD as a "solution" for disability or chronic illness reduces incentives to improve treatment and care for people with these conditions;
- Canadians do not want an ableist healthcare system where the lives of those with disabilities are seen as not worth living;
- Many disability advocates in Canada have expressed opposition to allowing MAiD for people with disabilities;

Therefore we, the undersigned citizens and residents of Canada, call upon the Government of Canada to:

• Protect all Canadians whose natural death is not reasonably foreseeable by prohibiting MAiD for those whose prognosis for natural death is more than six months.
